## Focus of PPG spending in

Priority One:	Social, Emotional and Behaviour
Objective:	To provide opportunities for individual children to access activities to increase their Social, Emotional and Behaviour Skills
Priority Two:	Further Enrichment of the curriculum to raise attainment
Objective:	To provide opportunities for all children to go on class trips related to topics, theatre trips, residential camping trip to Epping Forest, visiting theatre groups and storytellers
Priority Three:	Families
Objective:	To provide holiday activities across all the school holidays (except Christmas) for children and their families with familiar Robson House staff
Priority Four:	Continuing and expanding music provision
Objective:	To continue to provide individual and group music teaching and to increase the number of children who have individual music lessons. To provide opportunities for children to perform in Camden music concerts and with other schools
Priority Five :	Maintain High levels of Attendance
Objective:	To ensure that the very high levels of attendance are maintained in spite of the fact that over half the pupils do not or cannot access transport provided by the Local Authority, by staff bringing individual children to school when necessary
Priority Six :	Developing the School Library
Objective:	To develop the school library to raise the profile of reading in the school and support improved attainment in reading

## Measuring the impact of PPG spending

### **Access to after school activities with support from Robson House staff**

Children attend after school activities with Robson house staff and show increased SEB skills

### **Theatre trips and visiting theatre groups**

Increased language development

Increase attainment in reading and writing (Assessment data)

### **Residential camping trip to Epping Forest and transport for trips**

Increased self- confidence, greater independence,

better team- working, collaborative skills and improved social skills

Increased creativity and confidence in accessing the curriculum

### **Activities including Kayaking, trips, horse riding and refreshments**

Increasing numbers of families take part in holiday activities and have access to high quality activities and experiences

### **Individual and small group music lessons, new instruments and music books**

Increased numbers of children having individual lesson and children from

Robson House performing in Camden concerts

### **Staff to bring individual pupils to school if necessary**

Very high levels of attendance are maintained

### **Buy new books, furniture and soft furnishings for the library**

Increased attainment in reading and increased passion for reading of the children
